

From the Point of Rocks Community Historical Society

The day our famous Point of Rocks Bollman's Rock was blown up and down onto the railroad and largest part in the canal, where it stayed for 'a very long time.'

Saturday June 15, 1861 (148 yrs ago this week) ROCK RIDES RAILROAD RUDELY

All was chaos around Harpers Ferry, Va. Different Confederate armies were moving into and out of the vicinity, and Union forces were doing likewise. Everyone destroyed as much as they could, to deny it to the enemy.

In one case, Union engineers had to explode a 100-ton boulder which was found on the tracks of the B&O Railroad near, appropriately enough, Point of Rocks, Md.

Although it was assumed that this misdeed had been perpetrated by retreating Confederates, no one has ever figured out how they did it.

2008 Scholarship Winner - Where is She Now?

Point of Rocks, and especially the POR Ruritan Club is proud to report that our 2008 Jim Webb Memorial Point of Rocks Ruritan Scholarship winner, Miss Augusta Mary "Gussie" Pinson of Point of Rocks, has just completed her Associates in Arts degree from Frederick Community College, graduating on May 21st with Honors.

Her scholastic honors at FCC includes being a member of Phi Theta

Kappa; the International Honor Society for Community Colleges, and 2008 winner of the National Junior College Athletic Assoc. Academic All-American in the sport of Softball, the only one on her FCC women's softball team to do so in her 2 years on the team. She was also named to the Dean's List at FCC numerous times throughout her time there.

In high school, Miss Pinson was in the National Honors Society and Student Government. She did many things for the community through her involvement with these clubs. Her favorite classes were history and photography. At FCC her favorites classes were abnormal psychology, human relations, and American literature.

Photography remains a favorite hobby. Gussie walks around town taking plenty of shots of the train station and our other historic buildings.

Staying on-track and focused, Gussie is planning to attend Frostburg State University in Frostburg, Maryland to pursue a Bachelor's degree in Social Work, where she would like to

specialize in child protective services and domestic violence. Her ultimate goal is to eventually pursue a master's degree in that field of study.

What a pleasure I had one afternoon sitting in Aroma House Pizza just down the street from the Pinson's home - talking to one young lady who has made good use of the \$1,000 scholarship.


As many residents in Point of Rocks Estates know, Gussie has an identical twin sister - Abby. Both sisters graduated from Brunswick High in 2006, both with outstanding academic accomplishments. They both graduated from BHS with Honors. Abby was Miss POR in 2005, with Gussie as her runner-up.

The Pinson's, Jim & Trudy, moved into the POR Estates in 1984, giving their twin daughters, Gussie and Abby a great place to grow up.

The Pinson twins attended Jefferson's Valley Elementary, Brunswick Middle, and Brunswick High School. Activities included Girl Scouts from 1st to 5th grade and sports.

Gussie played basketball for 1 year in elementary school. She was a member of the Lovettsville Dolphin's swim team in middle school for two years. She also played basketball for 2 years at Brunswick High School.

However, the sport of softball has been the main athletic passion of Gussie's. She started out playing T-Ball in Kindergarten. She played T-Ball for a few years through elementary school when she had to take a break from the sport because she broke her collar bone twice in 5th grade.



Her favorite position is 2nd base; where she predominantly played. Once she graduated from Brunswick in 2006, she then played for Frederick Community College for the 2007 and 2008 seasons. It was a FCC where she was able to work hard to get the Academic All-American Award.

Since team eligibility is for only 2 years for students who play at the

community college level, Gussie had to hang her cleats up this past year. She might pick the sport back up this fall at Frostburg.

While at FCC, full time studies, working at Party City in Frederick, and being on the softball team felt like 3 full-time jobs.

Gussie talks about how much she enjoyed school in our local small towns like Jefferson and Brunswick, where the sense of community in a safe surrounding is possible. She looks to help families in a similar small community with her degree in Social Work.

What motivated this desire for social work? Funny thing, it was a movie on TV she watched while in middle school. The true story just struck her as being unfair and tragic for the battered wife - that was when the idea of being a social worker was the career path she wanted to pursue.

It is most satisfying is to hear how grateful Gussie is for each one of the scholarships and support she received so far. But, with this help

comes the responsibility to make the best use of the funding.

She expressed what a good feeling to have the honor of your own community's scholarship, While the cost of schooling is big-ticketed these days, every bit helps.

Many parents would naturally worry about their child moving into on -campus college life - this young lady appears to really have her priorities in line and have developed quite a set of disciplinary guidelines for herself.

We wish her the best of life. This young lady has her goals clearly defined, disciplines well developed, and she is not afraid of hard work to achieve those goals. Her great outgoing personality will help to make the best use of her skills.

Gussie will do very well indeed.

Miss Pinson took advantage of making CFFC Universal Scholarship Application and the new selection guidelines making this scholarship available to any full-time student in a college or trade school, up until the age of 21. At the time, she was attending Frederick Community College.

In 2008, Gussie was the first scholarship to be award from the this scholarship endowment fund, established with the Community Foundation of Frederick Co..

Youth group participants do not have to be a member of the fire company to participate, and parents may stay if they wish. There is no cost to participate. "I think it's a good avenue to learn what the fire service is all about," said Buck Young, group leader. The group meets from 6 to 8 p.m. Friday at the company's Point of Rocks station at 1809 Ballenger Creek Pike. 
- Background of the 185-mile long National Park passing by Point of Rocks
